We started this session in September at **Phase One Studios**, with a meeting featuring acoustician **Martin Pilchner** discussing acoustic upgrades and retrofits to the studio, followed by a social time and studio walkaround later. As well, engineer **Jeff Wolpert** discussed surround microphone techniques for scoring. October's meeting featured audiologist **Marshall Chaisin's** presentation on "The Weird Ear", where he discussed the latest research on how the human ear works, including otoacoustic emissions.
