Steven Bourgon Air Canada Flight Simulation Duty Operations Manager

Steve began his Simulator Career working on the Aurora Operations Mission Simulator in Greenwood N.S. in the Military, in 1982. After 2 years, he did taught avionic maintenance at the CF Aerospace Technology and Engineering School in Borden, ON.

He joined Air Canada in May 1990 as a Flight Simulator Technician/Technologist which entailed doing all hardware and software troubleshooting and repair of the different Flight Simulators. After 12 years he was promoted to Duty Operations Manager which involves managing a crew of 6 technologists and also providing software integration and Quality Control of the Airbus Flight Simulator.

lan Robin, P.Eng Gennum Corporation

Ian Robin is currently a Business Development Manager in the Audio & Wireless Division of Burlington-based Gennum Corporation. He is involved in developing new business ventures that leverage Gennum's unique combination of ultra-low-power hi-fidelity audio technology, advanced chip packaging capability and Bluetooth[®] expertise. Prior to joining Gennum, Ian was a Senior Sales Specialist with IBM's Technology Group, specifically focused on selling IBM's leading-edge silicon solutions to customers across Canada. Interestingly, Ian actually started his career at Gennum as the IC Design Group's first Modeling Specialist, developing empirical and analytical semiconductor device models for SPICE circuit simulation.
