"The Olympic Suite" music package for the Olympic Games contained more than 240 cues and delivered as more than 1100 pieces of audio media. Over 400 animated production elements were designed, mixed and deployed. More than 40 hours of 'Feature' content was pre-produced for in-games use.

Tackling the audio for this massive undertaking would be daunting under any circumstances - but to do it in support of the first ever Olympic Winter Games to be produced entirely in 5.1 Surround was remarkable.

In what will prove to be a whirlwind evening, we'll provide some insight into Infrastructure, Training, Workflow, Sound Design, Music Production and much more - from pre-production through to the Closing Ceremony.
